SOUTH DAVIS NEIGHBORHOOD PARK PLAY AREA REVITALIZATION PROJECT

Dear Residents:

The City of Santa Rosa is contracting with Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation of Petaluma, California for construction of the above referenced project. Construction will begin in October 2025 and last approximately 5 months. This project includes a new play area with playground equipment for 2-5- and 5–12-year-olds, an accessible trail around the play area, benches, a picnic area, lighting, a bike rack, and fencing. This project will also involve the removal of hazardous trees and installation of new sidewalk, curb, and gutter. (See reverse for Project Limits).

Completion of this project is vital to the integrity of our community infrastructure. Some of the benefits this project will bring to your neighborhood include:

- Creating a more comfortable public space by adding fencing between the play area and South Davis Street, placing low-level lighting between the play area and the Caltrans wall, and removing hazardous trees;
- Making the park more inclusive by adding ADA accessible picnic tables, pathways, and play features; and
- Providing permanent waste enclosures to help keep the park clean.

Though temporary impacts to your neighborhood are inevitable, our goal is to improve our community infrastructure without creating any more disturbance than necessary. The Contractor will be advised that daily and weekly activities such as mail delivery and garbage service must continue during the project and provide adequate notices for lane closures and parking restrictions.
