



ANNUAL PAVEMENT MAINTENANCE FAQ

Q: Do you have a projected date for my area?

Doorhangers will be used to notify residents and businesses 72 hours in advance of work to be done on their street. The most current information, to be updated daily, is available at: <https://cippublic.srcity.org/ProjPages/2497.html>

Q: How are streets selected for this work?

The purpose of these preventative maintenance measures is to extend the life of a road which is already in good condition (possibly with minor adjustments needed before slurry application). This delays the need to completely reconstruct the road. A team of City staff continuously rates the roads and selects those to include in this project. Some streets have gone beyond the scope of preventative maintenance and will require a more aggressive road reconstruction. Those streets are identified and would have their own project separate from this one.

Q: Do you have potential times when road closures would be happening?

A road or lane will only be closed for a single day to apply the slurry. Work will take place between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. Travel lanes will be kept accessible as much as possible, with flagging and two-way traffic control at times.

Q: Will I be able to access my property or driveway?

On your designated day of work, access to driveways may be limited. Please plan accordingly.

Q: What if there's an emergency and I need to call 911, will emergency vehicles be able to reach me?

Yes, emergency vehicles will always have access during this construction.

Q: Will sidewalks be open?

Yes, this work is specifically within the roadway.

Q: Where can I park my vehicle during road closures?

The contractor has planned to sequence the work into groups. The grouping of streets can be found on our posted maps (see webpage). Please plan to park your vehicle outside of those limits on your assigned day.

Q: What if my vehicle is parked on the street on the day slurry is applied, what happens to my vehicle?

Every effort will be made to contact the registered owner of a vehicle through the Santa Rosa Police Department. However, if needed, they are towed at the owner's expense.

Q: Will there be noise?

Our goal is always to minimize disruption to residents; however, construction noise is to be expected between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Q: Will my business be able to be open during slurry operations?

Yes, customers should be made aware of the need to park off the street on your designated day of road closure.

Q: Will there be any trimming of landscaping?

Landscaping that has grown into the right of way may be trimmed subject to the discretion of staff.
